My dear Harrod,

Thank you for your letter of the 25th July. I am afraid that I shall be on leave for a week starting on Saturday next, so that neither Saturday nor the following Thursday are any use to me.

Is your interest mainly in Andrews' memorandum? Our meeting on July 22nd was mostly about the attitude of the allies towards economic matters generally, and in particular, Article 7. I think that Andrews' proposals were only mentioned once in passing - certainly we did not discuss them at all. What I suggest is that you might have a word with Ronald Fraser, to whom I have sent a copy of your letter and of this. He was present at the meeting of July 22nd and can tell you as much as I can
