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I wonder how the sorting of the Keynes material is proceeding.

I do not know whether you know that Hayeh is writing a memoir on littgenstein and in this connection he has now written twice to ask me if I can inform him about letters from to Keynos. They here of course close friends at one time. On the first occasion I robbed him off saying that I could not recall any such letters and felt sure that if there had been any of any note I should recall them. But now he returns to the charge. He has copies of letters from Keynes to littgenstein dated March 29th and recomber 27th 1924, which refer to letters from to him, and Mayek naturally wants to know whether these letters are in existence.

Then I was working in 46, Gordon Square, I could probably have laid my hand on them if they had existed, since I had unfathomed all the secrets about which kinds of letters were to be found in which folors, drawers, etc., but now I suppose that everything has been thrown together, and I do not in the least know how far the reclassification has proceeded. Tould it be possible, without intolerable bother, to ascertain if these letters exist? I feel I cannot ignore haven's enquiry. Hayek is a cousin of littgenstein. I am told, although I do not know, that littgenstein devotees are not opposed to his making this attempt. I suspect, between ourselves, that they would rather have someone quite innecent of philosophy do a memoir than have someone who thought he knew what so sphilosophy really meant, which might be in ill accord with the views of the devotees.

Forgive my bothering you with all this.
