My dear Harrod

The Keynes papers here are not very extensive, and I can say with a fair degree of confidence that there are no letters from Wittgenstein. Geoffrey took away from Gordon Square all the correspondence, and I suspect that it had been considerably reduced in bulk before the residue was passed on to us.

There are about 35 small folders containing letters from individual correspondents, and I attach a list of these to this letter. There are in addition Maynard's letters to Lydia and Lydia's to Maynard, and there is a file called the Super "Tuff-Nuff" Expanding Wallet, which contains letters from other correspondents, filed alphabetically. There are no Lytton Strachey or Virginia woolf letters, and I think the father were returned to John Strachey. This, I am afraid, will make you cross, but Geoffrey, quite naturally, did not consult me about the correspondence and, since he is the executor responsible for it, I can only accept gratefully what he has sent. Please do not take this matter up with him, it would serve no useful purpose at this stage. A certain amount of correspondence of a purely economic nature has been sent to the Marshall Library, but I do not for a moment think that this would have included any of Wittgenstein's letters. from individual correspondents, and I attach a list of of wittgenstein's letters.
