My Dear Harold,

Mrs. Palyi is supposed to arrive tomorrow if everything works out alright. I do not know where we shall stay; we shall probably take a furnished flat somewhere in Kensington. At any rate the "Midland" address will find me.

I ~~am~~ leave next week for 8 to 10 days for Budapest to look after some frozen Pengoes and to arrange things for my Mother who is living there. Mrs. Palyi will forward messages if anything important should come up.

May I tell you once more how much obliged I am to you for your kind suggestion about Oxford. Indeed I do not know how I shall thank you, whatever the outcome may be. Of course, a positive result would be of the greatest value to me <sup>in</sup> spite of the negative <sup>financial</sup> outlook for the following reasons.

1. It would be very important for my standing <sup>in</sup> and towards Germany if I left the country on a matter of public appearance without a specific reason. I need not give you more details about this.
2. It may be extremely important for my getting, or not getting, the promised indemnity by my Bank and the permission for transferring it to England, especially the latter which entirely depends whether I have some obvious reason for "Staying outside or not".
3. Such an invitation as the one in question would be very important also for my academic standing. My friends in the States will certainly try to bring me in contact in due course with one or other University over there and it is important, perhaps vital, that I should not lose in the meantime the academic practice.
